Note the colors provide one possible correlation across various cultures of their main gods (red, yellow text), their secondary gods (yellow, brown text), their tertiary gods (orange, blue text), gods representing natural processes (green, silver text), gods handling death and the underworld (violet, maroon text), and men who are viewed by some to have progressed to become perfect (brown, orange text), as commanded in Matthew 5:48 ("Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.")
Also note there are only two lines of text for each entry in the table, typically with 3 to 5 words per line, to describe each "god." As with many other aspects of this book, this chart is intended to provide a start, which will be corrected, added to, expanded on, and improved until it becomes a more complete and accurate representation of The Gods of Mankind.
