

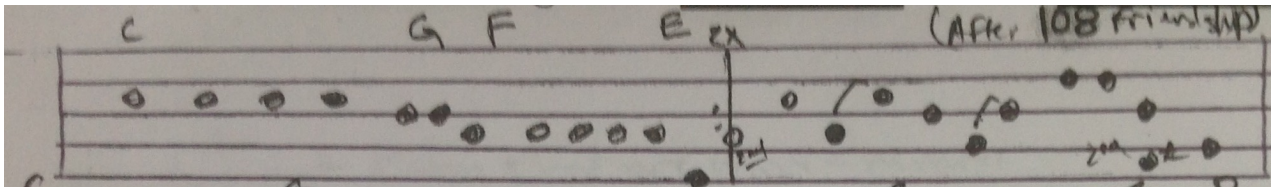

 C Finding ways to help each other striving to be wise

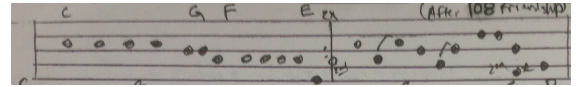
