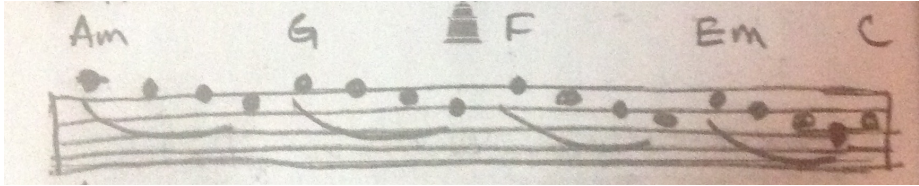

History will write the stories Telling who knew what is true From the way we live our lives

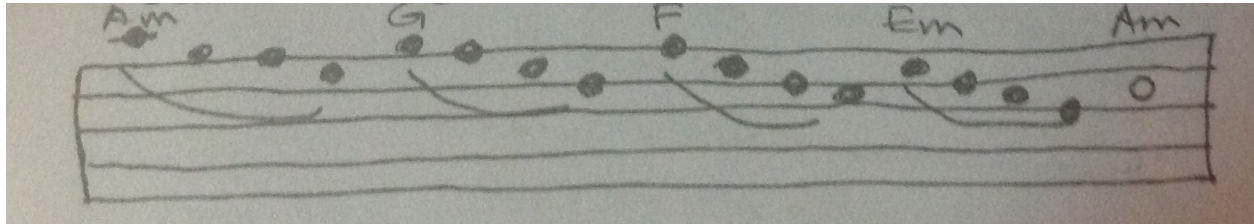
